This retreat unpacks, explores and addresses the personal responsibility side of courage.





The Own Your Brilliance retreat is an intimate and immersive experience that amplifies Black, young professional women's ability to courageously speak up, step up and show up at work.

This hands-on, two-day event gives feedback, support and guidance to participants in a

psychologically-safe environment with other young women of color who are doing the work to bust limiting beliefs, understand the inner workings of fear and courage, and create courageous plans of action to own their brilliance in professional spaces.

WHY IS IT BEING HOSTED?

Black, young professional women have the power to transform themselves, their teams and their organizations with their unique perspectives and prowess, but ...

For far too long, they've been keeping their words under wraps to avoid coming across as too aggressive. They've been hiding what makes them brilliant to align with convention, and they've been waiting for someone to say it's their turn to avoid stepping on another person's toes.

When Black, young professional women remain silent and agreeable, the become disengaged, less productive contributors.

And, their organizations lose opportunities to capitalize on divergent thinking, explore unique solutions and innovate faster — all of which impact the bottom line.

BY THE NUMBERS

While companies are catching up to creating a culture of courage where everyone can perform to their potential, it remains critical for Black, young professional women to practice self-advocacy to impact their work experiences.

62%

of Black women don't feel like their managers show interest in their careers.

56%

of Black women don't feel comfortable disagreeing with co-workers.

51%

of Black women don't feel like senior coworkers publicly praise their skills.

41%

of Black women want to be top executives, compared with 27% of white women.

HOW IS THE RETREAT STRUCTURED?

For two content-filled days, participants:

- Engage in exercises to define their brilliance and clarify their values
- Learn and apply the courage process to help them advocate for themselves at work
- Unpack the results of their DiSC work-style assessment and use insights to help them build professional relationships

- Create 60-day plans of courageous action
- Collaborate and learn from other Black, young professional women
- Connect over group meals in 5-star venues
